If my kids don't "go" to school, does that mean we're homeschooling?

Not necessarily. Here are some questions that can help you understand the difference.

	Homeschooling	Not Homeschooling
How do students enroll?	Via form PI-1206 submitted to the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction.	Sign up/enroll via any avenue other than submitting DPI form PI-1206.
Who can enroll?	Only children from a single family unit can be enrolled in a home-based private educational program.	Children from multiple family units may be enrolled in the program.
Who is responsible for record-keeping?	Parents/guardians responsible for all record-keeping.	An institution* keeps records on students. Parents/guardians may also retain some records.
Who chooses curriculum?	Parents/guardians are 100% responsible within framework of Wisconsin homeschooling law.	Provided by an outside institution*, or chosen from a set of options pre-selected by an institution.
Who is responsible for setting standards, including testing, grading, and other evaluation?	Parents/guardians have sole responsibility.	Overseen by an institution*, either directly or by providing guidance or evaluation criteria.
Who issues a high school diploma?	High school diploma is granted by parents/guardians.	Granted by an institution*.
Who determines graduation requirements?	Parents/guardians set graduation requirements.	Determined by state guidelines or private institution.

•You cannot file form PI-1206 until your child is age 6 on or before September 1st of the current year. *An institution can be a school district, public school, private school, virtual or charter school.
