This letter serves to inform you that I am also the administrator of a Home-Based Private Educational Program ("Homeschool"), as defined in Wisconsin Statute 115.001(3g) and <child(ren)'s name(s)> is/are now enrolled in my homeschool. Providing you with this notice is a courtesy, and is not required by law.

I am writing in response to your [letter/phone call] dated <date of letter or phone call>, in which you are requesting <that I file the PI-1206 Homeschool Report early / other information requested>.

This is to advise you that in accordance with Wisconsin laws governing a Home-Based Private Educational program, I will be filing the PI-1206 Homeschool Report with the Department of Public Instruction (DPI) between September <date of the third Friday> and October 15, <year>. The school district will receive a copy of the completed form from the DPI. The proper filing of the PI-1206 Homeschool Report with the DPI is the end of reporting responsibilities of Wisconsin homeschoolers, under the law. Therefore, I respectfully decline your request for <filing the PI-1206 Homeschool Report early / other information requested>.

Under Wisconsin Statute 118.133(1)(a), my child shall be permitted to participate in interscholastic athletics in the school district on the same basis and to the same extent that it permits pupils enrolled in the school district to participate.
